DAY 1: ZAGREB

Arrival to Zagreb airport; flight details TBA.

Meet your driver for a private transfer to the luxury hotel of The Regent Esplanade – an elegant hotel situated in the heart of historic Zagreb. Spend the morning at your leisure in the Lower Town where you will enjoy the charming ambiance of the streets full of boutiques, cafes and bookshops. We recommend you to visit the origin cravat fashion shop "Croata" where you may buy origin Croata cravats, scarves and neckties because you are in homeland of cravat.



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In the afternoon, meet your local guide at the lobby for a private sightseeing tour of the historic core of **Zagreb**.

The capital of Croatia illustrates both the continental and the Mediterranean spirit of the nation it spearheads. This is a city with tumultuous history, warm and inviting, and it will surely fulfill all your expectations. The façades of Zagreb's buildings reflect the ebb and flow of history, while its streets and squares bear witness to the coming together of

the many cultures that have shaped its identity.

Your guide will take you for a walk from Zrinjevac, through the avenues of trees and flowers to the main city square of Ban Jelacic, the heart of the city. You will continue the tour to the Upper Town and its mediaeval twin settlements: secular Gradec and ecclesiastical Kaptol, both preserved till today. You will discover its cobblestone streets, mediaeval towers, the vivacious green market; old houses and churches (Cathedral of Mary's Assumption in the neo-gothic style, St. Mark's church with the beautiful multi-colored roofs decorated with Croatian historical coats of arms...). Then you will continue by funicular or walk to the Lower Town, dominated by the impressive building of the Croatian National Theatre. The neo-baroque edifice is surrounded by numerous Art Nouveau buildings that represent Croatian architecture of the end of the 19th and the beginning of the 20th century.

As a perfect ending of your tour, we will take you for a **CALVADOS CLUB Extraordinary Experience: Visit Mimara Museum with the Museum's Curator**. Mimara Museum is located in the neo-renaissance palace from 19th century and abounds in pieces of art, icons, statues and other exhibits of art from around the world, from ancient times to 19th century.

This evening enjoy a welcome dinner at Zinfandel's restaurant of The Regent Esplanade Hotel of Zagreb. Unique environment created at the Zinfandel's and superb cuisine that combines excellent local ingredients with tastes from all over the world are the winning combination for superb dining experience in the heart of Zagreb.

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DAY 2: ZAGREB - TRAKOSCAN CASTLE - KUMOROVEC - OTOCEC CASTLE - BLED LAKE



This morning meet your guide and driver for your private full day tour from Zagreb, through Trakošćan and Otočec castles, to Bled. After a 1-hour ride you will arrive to **Trakošćan Castle**. Sitting upon a hill and facing its reflection in the lake underneath, the castle leads us into a true fairy tale. A stunning neo-gothic castle dates all the way back in the 1334, when it was only a fortification of Trakošćan. It changed quite a few hands throughout the history and was finally inherited by the count Janko Drašković, who decided to build himself a summer residence. Walking through the halls furnished with Renaissance, Baroque, Rococo and neo-classicistic pieces, with stoves and mirrors, you will be able to reconstruct a whole world gone by. Then you will continue to Slovenia and **Otočec Castle**, an extraordinary Gothic - Renaissance property where you will

enjoy a **private wine tasting**. The castle's wine cellar is a treasure trove of fine wines from Slovenian wine regions, of French champagnes and other world-class wines.

The only castle in Slovenia, located on an island in the middle of the lake, starts in 2010 as the newest member of an acknowledged association of mansions and hotels Relais & Châteaux.

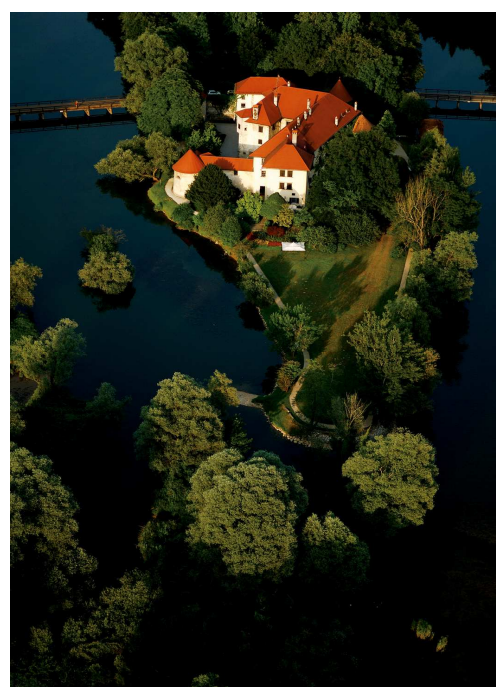
After wine tasting you will enjoy a private lunch at Hunter's Room. Your palate will be tempted by delicacies that exhibit incredible creativity and blend different culinary periods, thanks to the head of the castle restaurant, Robert Gregorčič, and his team of cooks.

Later this afternoon, you will arrive to Bled and your hotel - Vila Bled - charming boutique situated on the beautiful Bled Lake. With its traditional style reminiscent of the 1950' and unique historic ambience, it is a favorite retreat from everyday life.

DAY 3: BLED - LJUBLJANA - ROVINJ

This morning meet your guide and driver in the hotel for a full day exploration of Bled Lake and Ljubljana town that will end in Rovinj, in the region of Istria. Sheltered by picturesque mountains, the town of **Bled** reigns in the middle of an Alpine lake. Cosmopolitan seekers of diversity and beauty find their



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inspiration in the tranquil surroundings of Bled, its cultural treasures and natural wonders. Your guide will take for a walk around the lake and a traditional boat ride to the tiny island on the lake. That is where the ancient Slavs worshipped Živa, goddess of love and fertility. You will also visit the baroque Church of the Assumption, which stands in the middle of

an islet. Your guide and driver will take you the beautiful **Bled Castle**, which the oldest castle in the country. Perched atop a steep cliff above the glacial Lake Bled, the castle is the premier attraction of this area. The image of the castle forms a dramatic backdrop to the romantic island and the church on it and lures you to explore its rich cultural legacy. Today the castle is preserved as a museum, where you will be able to discover various exhibits depicting the history of the region. Enjoy the spectacular view over the lake and the mountains before you guide and driver take you to Ljubljana. **Ljubljana** is known to be one of the smallest and most charming European capitals, whose name means „the beloved“. The city combines facilities and efficiency of a metropolis and the relaxed ambiance of a small town. Its young and vibrant pulse lures one to wander around the cobblestone streets with numerous cafes, galleries, parks and green areas. You will explore the city center with your guide, starting from the Baroque Town Hall building, to the Town Square with the famous Fountain of the Tree Rivers and the funicular ride which will take you to the top of Castle Hill. The Ljubljana Castle offers spectacular views over the city and the surrounding countryside. Back in the Old Town, you will continue across the Dragon Bridge - an Art Nouveau masterpiece adorned with dragons and the symbol of Ljubljana, and stroll alongside the Ljubljanica River to the centrally located and bustling Preseren Square. If you wish, you can also enjoy some time on your own. In the afternoon, you will say good-bye to your guide and continue with your driver to Rovinj.

Upon arrival, you will check in to your hotel. Monte Mulini Hotel is one of the most luxury properties in Croatia, a boutique hotel situated in a charming bay, not far from the center of Rovinj.

This evening enjoy your dinner at Wine Valut fine restaurant of Monte Mulini Hotel.

The fine dining restaurant has a limited number of seats and a private dining



area. Its traditional decor adds to the wine cellar atmosphere, with contemporary art details complimenting the sense of understated luxury. Experience the Wine Vault's contemporary blend of French and Mediterranean cuisine, accompanying your meal with a selection of wines from sommelier Emil Perdec's extensive yet carefully selected collection of 500 vintages

DAY 4: ROVINJ - TOUR OF ISTRIA - ROVINJ

This morning your guide and driver will meet you in the hotel to begin your exploration of the Istrian Peninsula. This region has always attracted a special kind of visitors: those who consider gastronomy as one of the most important reasons for traveling. The alluring character of this region lies not only in its beautiful coast but also in the inland, described as the *terra incognita* - an unknown, unexplored land. This magnificent region thus combines two different climates and forms a unique gastronomic entity consisted of the exquisite Mediterranean seafood of the coast and the products of the inland's gardens, orchards and vineyards. As a whole, the gastronomy of Istria represents a complete harmony of flavors and it is yours to discover...

As you drive through the rugged and hilly terrain you will come to **Grožnjan** - a small ancient hilltop town in northwestern Istria. Grožnjan takes great pride in its wealth of tradition, cultural heritage and natural beauty, all of which is ennobled by art. Today, numerous cultural and historical landmarks serve as backdrops for cultural manifestations and entertainment in approximately twenty private galleries and studios. You will continue to the picturesque village of **Nardući** where you will enjoy a private wine tasting at the famous Franc Arman winery. Grape-growing and winemaking have long been the economic mainstay of generations of families in Istria. Traditionally passed down from father to son, vineyards were cultivated and worked by hand, often with little or no mechanisation, well into the mid-twentieth century. Established in 1850, Franc Arman Vineyards and Winery, headed today by Franc and Oliver Arman, continues the family tradition and core values set out by founding father Edoardo, while taking the art and science of winemaking to new levels. After the wine tasting, you will head out to the village of Livade, one of the most important centers of truffle farming in Europe. Here you will enjoy a **CALVADOS CLUB Extraordinary Experience: truffle hunting demonstration with a local farmer and his sniffer**



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dog. Until recently the Istrian white truffle was unknown on the world's stage of luxury gastronomy. Only those who are the true connoisseurs of this magical fungus come to visit the small corner of the world from which this delicacy originates.

You will enjoy the exceptional cuisine of the famous **Zigante Restaurant**. It's owner, Mr. Zigante, has earned his place

in the Guinness Book of Records as the one who has found the biggest (2.88lbs!) white truffle in the world. The restaurant offer truffles, as well as the other Istrian delicacies such as Pršut (Prosciutto) and local cheeses and meats, complimented by wines from Croatia's vineyards and the native grappa of the region. After lunch, not far from Livade, you may wish to visit the medieval ruins of the town of **Motovun**, an excellent example of the ancient townships that dotted the Istrian peninsula.

You will complete your tour in the charming town of **Rovinj**. The Old Town of Rovinj rises up on a peninsula and is a witness to times gone by and the valuable accomplishments of its past artisans. Experience the sights of this magical town while strolling with your guide down narrow streets to the magnificent church of St. Euphemia, the town's most important monument. This baroque building made in Venetian style was dedicated to the saint and martyr whose sarcophagus was miraculously washed ashore somewhere around 800. The town of Rovinj was declared a cultural monument in 1963.

Spend the evening at your lesiure in Rovinj.

DAY 5: ROVINJ - ZADAR - SPLIT

This morning meet your driver in the hotel for a private transfer to Split, via the antique town of Zadar. Upon arrival to **Zadar**, you will have some time for lunch in one of the local restaurants. Afterwards, you will meet your local guide for a private sightseeing tour of this beautiful town.



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An ancient Greek foundation under the name of Iader, later an important jewel in the Venetian crown as Zara and today the centre of the region, Zadar is a town-monument with layers of history that can be revealed on every step. Centuries-old tumultuous history, numerous destructions and reconstructions have left scars but also a rich historical legacy and today's valuable monumental heritage of the city. Numerous churches and cultural monuments dating from all historical periods have been preserved thus representing architectural works of art, from the Roman period through Middle Ages up to the modern architecture. Your guide will take for a walk through the cobblestone streets, from the church of St. Donat and the Cathedral of St. Anastasia Cathedral, to the Benedictine convent of St Mary and the

largest Roman forum on the East of the Adriatic, founded by the first Roman Emperor Augustus. You will also discover some contemporary attractions of Zadar. One of them is the Sea Organ, the site that is a blend of human ideas and the energy of the sea, a place for relaxation and contemplation while listening to an endless concert of the "Orchestra of Nature". Walking further down the waterfront, you will discover the "Greeting to the Sun", an impressive urban installation. Simultaneously with the "most beautiful sunset in the world", the lightning elements turn on and produce a marvelous light show in the rhythm of the waves and the sounds of the sea organ. You will continue with you driver towards **Split**. Upon arrival, you will check in to your hotel and spend the evening at your leisure.

DAY 6: SPLIT & TROGIIR

Meet your guide in the hotel lobby for a private sightseeing tour of **Split**, a 1700 years old town with famous Diocletian's Palace, included in the UNESCO's World Heritage list. The first inhabitant of Split was the Roman emperor Diocletian who started to build his palace in this friendly bay around 293 AD. After his abdication he withdrew to this luxurious palace to enjoy



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the rest of his days. Your guide will take you for a walk through this living monument and all its magnificent sights. You will discover the basement halls of the Palace and their unique role in the history of Split. Then you will continue to the Peristyle, the main square of the Palace that preserved the cult of emperor as the son of god. You will visit the Cathedral of St. Domnius, the patron-saint of Split, the temples of the Palaces, as well as the suites of the Emperor. You will explore the waterfront promenade of Split, the lively open green market and the monuments not only from antiquity, but also from the Middle Ages, Renaissance and Baroque.

After some time at your leisure, your driver and guide will take to **Meštrović Gallery**, in the elite part of the town by the sea shore. The gallery celebrates one of the most famous

Croatian artists of the 20th century – sculptor Ivan Meštrović. Even as a youngster in rural Croatia, Mestrovic showed a unique talent for molding clay. This talent was later honed in Zagreb and Vienna from which emerged an exquisite artist whose brilliant creativity translated itself into sculpture. The artist was known for immortalizing womanhood in pieces such as Maternity and the History of Croatia. The gallery in Split was the original residence of the artist.

Then you will continue to **Trogir** – a treasury cove of cultural and historical monuments dating as far back as the 4th Century BC.

Upon arrival you will have a lunch in local traditional restaurant.

Trogir - set on a small island just off the mainland, Trogir is a tiny charming town surrounded by impressive fortress walls. As you enter the fortified town through the Land Gate, you will stroll along its narrow streets, flanked by ancient stone houses. Your guide will walk you through all the magnificent monuments of this picturesque town: St. Lawrence Cathedral, a masterpiece of mediaeval architecture, with a magnificent Romanesque portal, carved by the Dalmatian sculptor Master Radovan in the 13th Century; the Old City Hall from the 15th Century, the city walls, the Kamerlengo tower, the relaxing waterfront promenade etc.

After some time on your own, your guide and driver will take



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you back to your hotel for an evening at your leisure.

DAY 7: SPLIT - ISLAND OF BRAC - SPLIT



This morning you will meet your guide and driver in the hotel for a full day excursion to the island of **Brač**, one of the most beautiful islands in the Adriatic. You will take the morning ferry from Split to the town of **Supetar**, the largest port on the island. Upon arrival, your exploration of this marvelous island can start. The old tale says that, at the dawn of history, the heaps of stone and the hill forts were first silhouetted on the ridges of Brač. The stone, so crucial for the life of this island, made it also world-famous: it is embedded in many magnificent buildings throughout the world. Let us just mention the 1700 years old Diocletian's Palace in Split, the glorious Dubrovnik city walls and the White House in Washington, DC... Today your guide will take you to a charming Mediterranean village of **Pučišća**, where people for

centuries live from the stone and for the stone. You will get a chance to **visit the Stonemasonry School that recently celebrated its 100th anniversary**. This unique educational institution that schooled so many superior craftsmen is preciously intertwined with the history and tradition of the island. You will continue with your guide and driver to the town of **Bol** – a Mecca for all the sea lovers. Hidden in the solitude of the southern coast and surrounded by crystal-clear translucent sea, Bol is also home to the word-famous beach: the Golden Horn (Zlatni Rat). The shape of this fine pebble beach constantly changes, attempting to conform to the will of the waves and gentle sea currents. Today you will also visit the Dominican monastery of Bol from the 15th century that houses a rich collection, from the extraordinary collection of underwater archaeology and prehistoric items to the early Christian sarcophagus and Venetian paintings. Today you will have typical Dalmatian style lunch “peka meal” in local Dalmatian style restaurant “konoba”.



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After lunch, you will continue to the **Vidova Mountain**, the highest peak in Adriatic with the spectacular views of the surrounding islands and mainland. Your tour will end in the charming village of **Škrip**, a typical Brač rural settlement. You will visit the Museum of the island of Brač, so conveniently located in this picturesque village that is, in a way, an exhibition itself. The Museum's collection covers archaeological remains from prehistoric and Roman times, as well as the remains of the early Croatian

structures and interesting exhibits of the history of the island. In the late afternoon, you will take a ferry back to Split for an evening at your leisure.

DAY 8: SPLIT - MOSTAR - STON - DUBROVNIK

This morning meet your guide and driver for a private transfer to Dubrovnik. On your way, you will visit **Mostar** – the unofficial capital of the region of Herzegovina. From Illyrian times until the Ottoman invasion, the ancient settlement of Blagaj was the centre of political power and Mostar was no more than a tiny settlement along the banks of the Neretva. It is believed that before Herzegovina fell to the Ottomans, the settlement of Mostar had only 19 houses with a small suspension bridge that united both banks. The men that guarded this bridge were called „mostari“ (the bridge keepers) and it is presumed that the town is named after them. Upon arrival, you will meet your local guide for a walking tour of the Old Town of Mostar. If there is any city in Europe that effortlessly straddles east and west, it is Mostar. You will walk along the Old Bridge and to Mostar's cobbled Ottoman Quarter, which houses the city's artists and craftsmen, as well as beautiful 16th – century mosques, museums and cafes. You will have lunch at local restaurant before your

transfer to Dubrovnik, via Ston – a small town known as the paradise for sea food lovers. Famous Ston oysters are known as the best aphrodisiac from the Roman period. You will get a unique opportunity to try these delicacies in one of the best sea food restaurants in Croatia – Bota Šare. Enjoy oyster tasting with a glass of wine and should you wish, stay for lunch and try the wide palette of seafood plates prepared as per original local recipes. Ston was



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also an important military fort of the Ragusan Republic, which was well protected by massive city walls and used Pelješac to build another line of defense. At Pelješac's narrowest point, just before it joins the mainland, a wall was built from Ston to Mali Ston. With over 5 km of length; the mediaeval walls from the 14th century are the biggest city walls in Europe. The wall meant to protect the precious salt pans that contributed to Dubrovnik's wealth, which are still being in use today. The

history of the salt works in Stone lasts for more than 4,000 years. It is the oldest salt mine in Europe, and among the working ones, also the oldest in the world.

Upon arrival to Dubrovnik, check in to your hotel and spend the evening at your leisure. You will enjoy the Bellevue Hotel – the splendid location, stunning views and chic ambiance.

DAY 9: DUBROVNIK

This morning meet your local guide for a private walking sightseeing tour of **Dubrovnik** – one of the most beautiful stone-built cities in the world. A town-museum is a one-of-a-kind destination which makes you fall in love it and come back to it over and over again in an endless pursuit of unique experiences. More than a thousand-year history is reflected in every part of the town.

An important maritime port and a one-time state, it has always been a cultural metropolis. As one of UNESCO World Heritage Sites, Dubrovnik owes its special charm to the historic monuments which testify to its rich history. The works of artists, writers and scientists of Dubrovnik have been woven into the texture of the town.

You will experience the splendour of its stone and the redness of its roofs, the walk through its lively streets and the unforgettable beauty of this living monument. While strolling with your guide down Stradun, the main street, you will stop to visit the Franciscan monastery of the “Order of Little Brothers” that preserves one of the three oldest pharmacies in Europe. You will continue down to Orlando



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Column and the Sponza Palace and visit the Church of St. Blasius, the patron-saint of the town. You will also discover Rector's Palace, the magnificent structure of the dukes of Dubrovnik, and the Cathedral of the Virgin Mary with a treasury containing the originals by Tiziano and Rafaelo and many other valuable relicts.

The rest of the afternoon is at your leisure to explore this stunning town on your own. Dubrovnik is full of charming cafes, boutiques and local curiosities, nestled in the intricate network of the cobblestone streets. We recommend you to take a walk along the city walls (2500 m around the old town), visit one of the numerous museums or take a funicular ride to the top of the Srđ hill.

Overnight in Dubrovnik.

DAY 10: DUBROVNIK - tour of MONTENEGRO HIGHLIGHTS - DUBROVNIK

This morning meet your driver in the hotel lobby for a private transfer to Montenegro - a mystical land of wild beauties. Your local guide will welcome you at the borderline of Croatia and Montenegro. You will ride through **Boka Kotorska**, the only fiord in the Mediterranean, surrounded by high cliffs that reflect in the deep blue sea. Your first destination is the old town of **Perast**, a sleepy baroque place on the seashore. The strong merchant navy tradition represents the best preserved baroque entity in the Adriatic. At that time seafaring was growing and captains built magnificent villas that even today capture you with their beauty. Perast also abounds in sacred monuments, such as the Church Sveti Nikola and Our Lady of the rocks, built on the artificial island just opposite of Perast.

Following your visit to Perast, your guide and driver will take you to the Old Town of **Kotor**, listed on the World Cultural and Natural Heritage List and protected by the UNESCO. The architecture of Kotor, a post-modern mix of the different epochs and its position at the bottom of the sharp cliffs of the Lovcen Mountain, makes it different from any other Mediterranean town. It is a city of traders and



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famous sailors, with many stories to tell. The Old City is a well preserved urbanization typical of the Middle Ages, built between the 12th and 14th century. Through the entire city the buildings are criss-crossed with narrow streets and squares. At one of them there is the Cathedral of St. Trifun, a monument of Roman culture and one of the most recognizable symbols of the city. You can also visit the Maritime Museum, situated in the Baroque

palace Grgurin, which preserves the fame of Boka navy. The memories on those long gone glorious days, on the successes of the famous Kotor sailors, ship builders and crafts man are all today kept in this museum.

Then you will continue to **Budva**, considered to be one of the oldest settlements in the Balkans. According to Greek mythology, Cadmo, the son of the Phoenician King Agenon, established Budva. After his expulsion from Thebes, Cadmo arrived in this area by ox-drawn cart, and founded Budva. This ancient town lies on a little island that was linked to land by a sandbar, and in time became a peninsula. You will get a chance to marvel at its surrounding 15th-century ramparts and medieval fortification system consisting of city gates, defense walls and towers. Inside the walls, you will find the town to be a combination of narrow streets and little squares, with superb monuments of the different Mediterranean cultures marking its development. After the tour you will say goodbye to your guide and continue with your driver back to Dubrovnik.

This evening enjoy Farewell dinner at Posat restaurant.
